Welcome and Call to Worship

Celebrant: Hosanna to the Son of David, the King of Israel.

All: Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord. Hosanna in the highest.

Celebrant: Dear brothers and sisters, from the beginning of Lent until now we have been preparing our hearts by repentance and self-sacrifice. Today, with the whole Church, we herald the beginning of the celebration of the Paschal Mystery. On this day our Lord Jesus Christ entered Jerusalem and was welcomed as King with palms and shouts of praise. Today we greet him as our King, though we know his crown was a crown of thorns, and his throne a cross.

Therefore, I invite you to follow our Lord this Holy Week, from his triumphal entry, through his suffering and death, to the glory of his resurrection.

Celebrant: The Lord be with you.

All: And with your spirit.

Celebrant: Let us pray. Assist us mercifully with your help, O Lord God of our salvation; that we may enter with joy upon the contemplation of those mighty acts, whereby you have given us life and immortality; through Jesus Christ our Lord who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever.

All: Amen.

Deacon: The Holy Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according

To Mark 11:1-11.

All: Glory to you, Lord Christ.

At the end of the reading:

Deacon: This is the Gospel of the Lord.

All: Praise to you, Lord Christ.

Blessing of the Palms

Celebrant: Let us pray. We praise you, Almighty God, for the acts of love by which you have redeemed us through your Son Jesus Christ our Lord. On this day he entered the holy city of Jerusalem in triumph and was hailed as King by those who spread their garments and branches of palm along his way.

Sanctify these branches with your blessing, we humbly pray, that they may be for us signs of his victory. Grant that we who bear them in his name may ever hail him as our King and follow him in the way that leads to eternal life; who lives and reigns with you, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever.

The Lessons

Isaiah 52:13-53:12 Psalm 22:1-11 Philippians 2:5-11

At the end of each reading, the lector says: Lector: This is the word of the Lord.

All: Thanks be to God.

The Passion of our Lord Jesus Christ according to St. Mark

[The customary responses before and after the Gospel are omitted. The congregation may be seated for the reading of the Passion.]

Narrator: When they reached a place called Gethsemane, he said to his disciples...

Jesus: Sit here while I pray.

Narrator: He took Peter, James, and John with him. Horror and dismay came over him, and he said to them...

Jesus: My heart is ready to break with grief; stop here and stay awake.

Narrator: He went forward a little, threw himself on the ground, and prayed that, if it were possible, this hour might pass him by.

Jesus: Abba, Father, all things are possible with you; take this cup away from me. Yet not what I will, but what you will.

Narrator: He came back and found them asleep, and he said to Peter...

Jesus: Asleep, Simon? Were you not able to stay awake for one hour? Stay awake, all of you; and pray that you may be spared the test. The spirit is willing, but the flesh is weak.

Narrator: Once more he went away and prayed. On his return he found them asleep again, for their eyes were heavy; and they did not know how to answer him. The third time he came and said to them...

Jesus: Still sleeping? Still, taking your ease? Enough! The hour has come. The Son of Man is betrayed to sinful men. Up, let us go forward! My betrayer is upon us.

Narrator: Suddenly, while he was still speaking, Judas, one of the Twelve, appeared, and with him was a crowd armed with swords and clubs, sent by the chief priests, lawyers, and elders. Now the traitor had agreed with them upon a signal:

Judas: The one I kiss is your man; seize him and get him safely away.

Narrator: When he reached the spot, he stepped forward at once and said to Jesus...

Judas: Rabbi.

Narrator: And kissed him. Then they seized him and held him fast. One from the party drew his sword, and struck at the High Priest's servant, cutting off his ear. Then Jesus spoke...

Jesus: Do you take me for a thief, that you have come out with swords and clubs to arrest me? Day after day I was within your reach as I taught in the temple, and you did not lay hands on me. But let the scriptures be fulfilled.

Narrator: Then the disciples all deserted him and ran away. Among those following was a young man with nothing on but a linen cloth. They tried to seize him, but he slipped out of the linen cloth and ran away without any clothes. Then they led Jesus away to the High Priest's house, where the chief priests, elders, and doctors of the law were all assembling. Peter followed him at a distance right into the High Priest's courtyard; and there he remained, sitting among the attendants, at the fire.

The chief priests and the whole Council tried to find some evidence against Jesus to warrant a death sentence but failed to find any. Many gave false evidence against him, but their statements did not tally. Some stood up and gave false evidence against him to this effect...

CONGREGATION: We heard him say, "I will pull down this temple, made with hands, and in three days I will build another, not made with hands."

Narrator: But even on this point their evidence did not agree. Then the High Priest stood up in his place and questioned Jesus...

High Priest: Have you no answer to the charges that these witnesses bring against you?

Narrator: But he kept silent; he made no reply. Again, the High Priest questioned him...

High Priest: Are you the Messiah, the Son of the Blessed One?

Jesus: I am, and you will see the Son of Man seated at the right hand of God and coming with the clouds of heaven.

Narrator: Then the High Priest tore his robes and said...

High Priest: Need we call further witnesses? You have heard the blasphemy. What is your opinion?

Narrator: Their judgment was unanimous: that he was guilty and should be put to death. Some began to spit on him, blindfolded him, and struck him with their fists, crying out,

CONGREGATION: Prophesy!

Narrator: And the High Priest's men set upon him with blows. Meanwhile, Peter was still below in the courtyard. One of the High Priest's serving maids came by and saw him there warming himself. She looked into his face and said...

Serving Maid: You were there too, with this man from Nazareth, this Jesus.

Peter: I know nothing. I do not understand what you mean.

Narrator: Then he went outside into the porch, and the maid saw him there again and began to say to the bystanders,

Serving Maid: He is one of them.

Narrator: And again, he denied it. Again, a little later, the bystanders said to Peter...

CONGREGATION: Surely you are one of them. You must be. You are a Galilean.

Narrator: At this he broke out into curses, and with an oath he said...

Peter: I do not know this man you speak of.

Narrator: Then the rooster crowed a second time; and Peter remembered how Jesus had said to him, "Before the *rooster* crows twice, you will disown me three times." And he burst into tears. As soon as morning came, the chief priests, having made their plan with the elders and lawyers in full council, put Jesus in chains; then they led him away and handed him over to Pilate. Pilate asked him...

Pilate: Are you the king of the Jews?

Jesus: The words are yours.

Narrator: And the chief priests brought many charges against him. Pilate questioned him again...

Pilate: Have you nothing to say in your defense? You see how many charges they are bringing against you.

Narrator: But, to Pilate's astonishment, Jesus made no further reply. At the festival season the Governor used to release one prisoner at the people's request. As it happened, the man known as Barabbas was then in custody with the rebels who had committed murder in the uprising. When the crowd appeared asking for the usual favor, Pilate replied...

Pilate: Do you wish me to release for you the king of the Jews?

Narrator: For he knew it was out of malice that they had brought Jesus before him. But the chief priests incited the crowd to ask him to release Barabbas rather than Jesus. Pilate spoke to them again...

Pilate: Then what shall I do with the man you call king of the

Jews?

CONGREGATION: Crucify him!

Pilate: Why, what harm has he done?

Narrator: But they shouted all the louder,

CONGREGATION: Crucify him!

Narrator: So, Pilate, in his desire to satisfy the mob, released Barabbas to them; he had Jesus flogged and handed him over to be crucified. Then the soldiers took him inside the courtyard and called together the whole company. They dressed him in purple, and twisting a crown of thorns, placed it on his head. Then they began to salute him with...

CONGREGATION: Hail, King of the Jews!

Narrator: They beat him about the head with a cane and spat upon him, and then knelt and paid mock homage to him. When they had finished their mockery, they stripped him of the purple and dressed him in his own clothes. Then they took him out to crucify him. A man called Simon, from Cyrene, the father of Alexander and Rufus, was passing by on his way in from the country, and they pressed him into service to carry his cross. They brought him to the place called Golgotha, which means, "Place of a Skull".

[ALL STAND]

Narrator: Then they fastened him to the cross. He was offered drugged wine, but he would not take it. They divided his clothes among them, casting lots to decide what each should have. The time of the crucifixion was nine in the morning, and the inscription giving the charge against him read, "The king of the

Jews." Two bandits were crucified with him, one on his right and the other on his left. The passers-by hurled abuse at him, wagging their heads...

CONGREGATION: Ha! You would pull the temple down, would you, and build it in three days? Come down from the cross and save yourself!

Narrator:

So too the chief priests and lawyers jested with one another:

CONGREGATION: He saved others, but he cannot save himself. Let the Messiah, the king of Israel, come down now from the cross. If we see that, we shall believe.

Narrator:

Even those who were crucified with him taunted him. At midday darkness fell over the whole land, which lasted till three in the afternoon; and at three Jesus cried aloud...

Jesus: Eli, Eli, lema sabachthani?

Narrator: Which means, "My God, my God, why hast thou forsaken me?" Some of the bystanders, on hearing this, said...

CONGREGATION: Hark, he is calling Elijah.

Narrator: A man ran and soaked a sponge in sour wine and held it to his lips on the end of a cane.

Man: Let us see if Elijah will come to take him down.

Narrator: Then Jesus gave a loud cry and died.

[SILENCE IS KEPT FOR A FEW MOMENTS]

Narrator: And the curtain of the temple was torn in two from top to bottom. And when the centurion who was standing opposite him saw how he died, he said...

CONGREGATION: Truly this man was the Son of God.

The Message

The Nicene Creed

Celebrant: Let us confess our faith in the words of the Nicene Creed:

All: We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen.

We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father, God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, of one being with the Father. Through him all things were made.

For us and for our salvation he came down from heaven: by the power of the Holy Spirit, he became incarnate from the Virgin Mary, and was made man. For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate; he suffered death and was buried. On the third day he rose again in accordance with the Scriptures; He ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead, and his kingdom will have no end.

We believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son. With the Father and the Son, he is worshiped and glorified. He has spoken through the Prophets.

We believe in one holy catholic and apostolic Church. We acknowledge one baptism for the forgiveness of sins. We look for the resurrection of the dead, and the life of the world to come. Amen.

Prayers of the People

Deacon: In the power of the Spirit and in union with Christ, let us pray to the Father.

Almighty God, our heavenly Father, you promised through your Son Jesus Christ to hear us when we pray in faith.

Strengthen Mark, our bishop, and all your Church in the service of Christ, that those who confess your name may be united in your truth, live together in your love, and reveal your glory in the world. Lord in your mercy

All: Hear our prayer.

Deacon: Bless and guide Joe, our president, and Mike, our governor; give wisdom to all in authority; and direct this and every nation in the ways of justice and of peace; that we may honor one another and seek the common good. Lord in your mercy

All: Hear our prayer.

Deacon: Give grace to us, our families, and friends, and to all our neighbors, that we may serve Christ in one another, and love as he loves us. Lord in your mercy

All: Hear our prayer.

Deacon: Comfort and heal all those who suffer in body, mind, or spirit...

(pause and speak their names aloud)

Give them courage and hope in their troubles, and bring them the joy of your salvation. Lord in your mercy

All: Hear our prayer.

Deacon: Hear us as we remember those who have died in the faith of Christ...

(pause and speak their names aloud)

According to your promises, grant us with them a share in your eternal kingdom. Lord in your mercy

All: Hear our prayer.

Deacon: Rejoicing in the fellowship of all your saints, we commend ourselves and the whole creation to your unfailing

love. Lord in your mercy All: Hear our prayer.

The Confession and Absolution of Sin

Celebrant: Let us humbly confess our sins to the Lord.

All: Most merciful God, we confess that we have sinned against you in thought, word and deed, by what we have done, and by what we have left undone.

We have not loved you with our whole heart; we have not loved our neighbors as ourselves. We are truly sorry and we humbly repent.

For the sake of your Son Jesus Christ, have mercy on us and forgive us; that we may delight in your will, and walk in your ways, to the glory of your Name. Amen.

Celebrant: Almighty God, our heavenly Father, who in his great mercy has promised forgiveness of sins to all those who sincerely repent and with true faith turn to him, have mercy upon you, pardon and deliver you from all your sins, confirm and strengthen you in all goodness, and bring you to everlasting life; through Jesus Christ our Lord.

All: Amen.

The Comfortable Words

The Prayer of Consecration

Celebrant: Holy and gracious Father: In your infinite love you made us for yourself; and when we had sinned against you and become subject to evil and death, you, in your mercy, sent your only Son into the world for our salvation.

By the Holy Spirit and the Virgin Mary he became flesh and dwelt among us. In obedience to your will, he stretched out his arms upon the cross and offered himself once for all, that by his suffering and death we might be saved.

By his resurrection he broke the bonds of death, trampling Hell and Satan under his feet. As our great high priest, he ascended to your right hand in glory; that we might come with confidence before the throne of grace.

On the night that he was betrayed, our Lord Jesus Christ took bread; and when he had given thanks, he broke it, and gave it to his disciples, saying, "Take, eat; this is my Body which is given for you: Do this in remembrance of me."

Likewise, after supper, Jesus took the cup, and when he had given thanks, he gave it to them, saying, "Drink this, all of you; for this is my Blood of the New Covenant, which is shed for you, and for many, for the forgiveness of sins: Whenever you drink it, do this in remembrance of me."

Mystery of Faith

Deacon: Therefore, according to his command, O Father:

All: We remember his death.

We proclaim his resurrection.

We await his coming in glory.

Celebrant: We celebrate the memorial of our redemption, O Father, in this sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving, and we offer you these gifts. Sanctify them by your Word and Holy Spirit to be for your people the Body and Blood of your Son Jesus Christ.

Sanctify us also, that we may worthily receive this holy sacrament, and be made one body with him, so that he may dwell in us and we in him. And bring us with all your saints into the fullness of your heavenly kingdom, where we shall see our Lord:

All: Face to Face.

All this we ask through your Son Jesus Christ: By him, and with him, and in him, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all honor and glory is yours, Almighty Father, now and forever.

All: Amen.

Celebrant: And now as our Savior Christ has taught us, we are bold to pray

All: Our Father Who art in Heaven,

Hallowed be Thy name. Thy kingdom come, Thy will be done on earth as in heaven.

Give us this day our daily bread.

And forgive us our trespasses

As we forgive those who trespass against us

And lead us not into temptation

But deliver us from evil

For Thine is the kingdom the power and the glory
